# Report of the ESO Education Committee

- The ESO summer school 2023 ran in L'Aquila and was very successful, well attended, with excellent feedback. The next summer school will be organised in 2024 in Vilnius, Lithuania and in 2025 Zadar, Croatia.
- The ESO focused workshop on subarachnoid haemorrhage was successfully organised in Utrecht Netherlands (22-24 October 2023). The next one is being organised on 12-15 April 2024 in Struga, North Macedonia. It will focus on the rare causes of stroke. 40 participants will be selected by the LOC and letters to invited speakers have been sent. The call for host 2025 is ongoing (deadline January 2024).
- The ESO Stroke Education platform (eSTEP) continues to increase its users. The platform has more than 900 learners so far and 7000 engagements. The platform is expanding towards more interactive exchanges and possibility of having CME credits.
- The online ESO Webinar series 3 continues and is planned until June 2024. The first webinar on Moyamoya arteriopathy was presented in December 2023. Attendance and interest were excellent (100-150 people).
- The ESO Education Committee provided oversight for the Stroke Winter School and Edinburgh Stroke Research Workshop.
- Department to department Visit Programme: 10 out of 31 applications were selected; 6 visits have been completed in September 2023, 4 visits have been organised.
- ESO Emerging Leader Programme: 3 winners were selected from 28 applications from 19 countries.
- Stroke Master Scholarship: candidate selection have been performed and the master is ongoing.
- ESO Education Committee collaborated with EAN for joint sessions at EAN and ESO conferences and VAS European Foundation for joint session during the 20th European Angiology Days and 2-International Clinical Cases Atlas, launched by VAS.
