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ESO GUIDELINES FOR RELATIONS WITH INDUSTRY

ESO recommends the following Guidelines for relations with Industry. Those seeking formal ESO endorsement of their meetings are expected to follow these guidelines. The guiding principle is *the avoidance of all real or perceived commercial bias*.

- 1. Commercial funding of the CME must be disclosed in all promotional and informational material.
- 2. The educational program cannot promote a single proprietary product, nor include distribution of advertising or promotional material. Programs must be balanced, presenting a broad range of scientifically supportable viewpoints related to the chosen topic.
- 3. The ESO accepts commercial funding only if it is an <u>unrestricted educational grant</u>.
- 4. Organizers of the ESO endorsed events agree they will promote activities of the European Stroke Organisation and the next European Stroke Organisation Conference (ESOC) on their website.
