



The local organising committee selected the participants on the basis of

- Application form including letter of motivation, CV and letter of support
- Maximum of two participants per country coming from European applicants and maximum of one participant from Non-European applicants (exception: South Africa due to a partner program)
- Three from Germany: one participant had a guaranteed place due to the Young Investigators Award at the ESO conference 2018 in Gothenburg, Sweden
- Three from Italy and three from the Netherlands: Each one was a successor for selected applicants having either declined or delayed accepted their participation. Both successors were selected according to their position in the ranking list and were among the best 15 % of all candidates
- Candidates without informative application and/or not among the first 85 % in the ranking were not selected (eight in total, among them, six from Europe)
- All applicants were expected to be ESO members or to have applied for ESO membership


